From the Vicar:

Giving Appeal to raise £ 50,000 before Christmas

I am delighted in the way the life of our church is flourishing in so many different respects. This is reflected in our worship on Sundays, the prayer life of the church, with our daily and weekly round of prayer in both our buildings and in each of our homes; our work with children and young people (including the choirs where we have regular contact with 100 children and young people each week), the music, the pastoral care team, the various home and study groups, our environment group, wider concerns outreach and other expressions of loving service.

I am so grateful to all who are part of Great St Mary's and give of their time, talents and money enabling us to be an inclusive, thriving church in the centre of Cambridge open seven days a week. In the last year we have invested in building up our music department, our clergy team and our children's and youth ministry. Great St Mary's has a special calling to serve and connect people in this city as we witness to the good news of Jesus Christ amidst the many challenges faced by our society and world.

Many of you will remember that in February we ran our annual stewardship campaign, the results of which were a wonderful testimony to the faithfulness and generosity of our congregations. The number of regular givers increased by 10 % and many of you increased your gifts.

As we come to the end of our financial year, however, we are facing serious challenges and are asking for everyone's help in responding to them. Members of our congregation dying or moving away over the last 18 months has resulted in an overall loss to our congregational giving of £12,000, despite the increase in the number of givers. Our heating boilers unexpectedly gave up and have had to be replaced last week (with a single, much more efficient boiler) and the cost, including removal of asbestos discovered during the replacement, was £36,000.

Our Treasurer and Finance Committee manage our funds very carefully, but with unanticipated losses and costs, we are now anticipating a deficit of £50,000 for this year. We receive no funding from the national Church or the Government. Our annual budget is £800,000 and we are very fortunate that we can generate 70% of the income to meet this budget from trading operations including the tower tours, the gift shop and Michaelhouse café. The remaining 30% comes from our

regular pledged giving, one-off donations and grant-making bodies. I am very grateful that our Assistant Director of Music, our Children's and Youth minister and half an administrator post are all supported through very generous individual donations.

In order to reach our goal and prevent a deficit, I want to ask you first to pray for this situation, offering to God our concern for what we are facing, and to ask that we find ways to make up the shortfall. At the bottom of this message are words of a prayer that you may wish to use.

Secondly, we are starting a Giving Appeal on Sunday 26 October inviting everyone to consider how they may be able to contribute to the shortfall, through a one-off donation, or starting or increasing regular giving. The campaign will conclude on 23 November. If you have any questions, please do speak to me or the church wardens.

A prayer: Loving God, you are always with us and give us all we need to be your Church. Help us, we pray, to give as we have received: abundantly, generously, and joyfully, that our worship and service may bear witness to your Kingdom of unfailing love. In the name of you Son who gave himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



About the exhibition

Icons on Ammunition Boxes is a conceptual project by Ukrainian artists Sofiia Atlantova and Oleksandr Klymenko launched in 2014. The icons are painted on fragments from ammunition boxes from the war zones in Ukraine and serve as silent war witnesses as well as symbols of the victory of life over death.

About the artists

SOFIIA ATLANTOVA (born on Dec. 14,1981, lives & works in Kyiv, Ukraine)
Graduate of the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture. Works in the field of monumental and easel painting, book graphics, installations.
Participated in exhibitions in Ukraine and abroad. Her books were included in short and long lists of several literary awards in Ukraine and abroad, in particular - "BBC Book of the Year".

OLEKSANDR KLYMENKO (born on July 5, 1976, lives & works in Kyiv, Ukraine)
Graduate of the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture, Institute of Art
History, Folklore and Ethnology and National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine.
Taught at the Kyiv State Institute of Decorative Arts and Design and at the
Higher Humanitarian Theological Courses (Kyiv). Participated in exhibitions in
Ukraine and abroad, organized of a number of literary and artistic events and
performances. Author of the idea and one of the curators of the Icons on
Ammunition Boxes.



GSM Wider Concerns - Intercessions



An important aspect of the ministry of GSM is developing partnerships in mission with those abroad as well as at home, raising funds and awareness. Such partnerships bring a global dimension to our work.

The theme is 'Bringing new life and hope'. We focus on supporting a relatively small number of ongoing projects particularly with a strong Cambridge connection, and where we can make a real difference. The emphasis is on partnership with local communities taking the lead in what

they consider is best for their community, particularly helping very poor communities become self-sustaining. Our support means a great deal, not only financially, but because we care and are there to help in times of emergency.

In the intercessions each Sunday, we pray for one of the projects on a rotating basis. At the main festivals of Harvest, Christmas, Easter and Peter-tide we have brown envelopes in the pews for donations to specific projects., usually one home and one overseas. We also have special collections for emergency disaster appeals.

Thank you to everyone for your wonderful ongoing support raising around £15,000 a year and for your prayers.



Charity Christmas Cards



Once again 'religious-themed' Christmas cards will be on sale at coffee in Michaelhouse after the 10am service. This will be from 26 October to 14 December (but NOT Remembrance Sunday) - or for as long as stocks last. The price remains the same as last year: 5 for £2.50. This means that it is easy to buy two or four packs for a fiver or tenner. Cash only, I'm afraid. What will we be supporting this time? With the blessing of the Wider Concerns Committee we shall contribute to 'Away From It All' Holidays. This provides holidays for Cambridgeshire families - recommended by family workers, clergy and teachers - who they feel would benefit from an experience that they could not

otherwise afford. They stay in static caravans in Hunstanton and enjoy lots of activities, with pocket money supplied to the children and funding towards food and travel. For many children it is the first time they have ever been on holiday.

We usually manage to raise about £150, once the cards have been paid for. Any extra donations also welcome. Thank you in advance for your support.


