

From the Vicar :

Immanuel – God-with-us

Happy Christmas



I am writing this Christmas message on 8th December, when the Church commemorates the 'Conception of the Blessed Mary' as a minor festival. With the conception of Mary the place, the womb, is being prepared for the *WORD to become flesh and to dwell among us, full of grace and truth.*

Every year again, I am deeply moved by the mystery that God chose to come among us as a human being. God saw our human need to feel a presence, to know God's own presence, to be loved, to be touched, to be seen and listened to by God as a human being.

God has always been present in his creation, from its beginning. God was with our biblical ancestors Abraham and Sarah, Isaac and Rebecca, Jacob and Rachel, Moses and David as well as the

people of Israel. God spoke through the prophets of God's tender love for his people and foretold through Isaiah that the virgin would conceive a child.

God understood the human need for close presence. And God came to us by a child, who grew in the womb of young Mary, was born as a tiny, vulnerable, tender baby. A God in the flesh for the people in the flesh. God took on the limitations of the flesh, and God loved the flesh. God, a little child in an animal feeding trough. God, a refugee child in Egypt. God, hidden in anonymity for 30 years in Nazareth. God walking the roads of Galilee and the streets of Jerusalem. God eating and talking with people. God touching sick bodies and healing. God, feeding hungry crowds. God weeping over the death of a friend. God suffering on the cross. God dying, resting in a tomb. God rising from the dead.

Above all, God had a heart of flesh, it was God's divine love that moved the human heart of Jesus. And, God's divine love moves our human hearts, too, when we invite God into our hearts; when we open ourselves to God's Holy Spirit and presence with us. Luke's gospel (Luke 2.19) tells us that Mary treasured the words and events surrounding her baby's birth and pondered them in her heart. 'To treasure in one's heart' means that the mystery of Christmas is happening within us. Our deepest self is caught up in wonder and awe. Christ is being born, not somewhere else, not even at a distant point in time, but in our hearts and among us, as God's divine love moves our hearts, too.

This Christmastide, may we find hope, courage, joy and peace as we ponder anew the mystery of God coming to us in his Son, taking human flesh and living among us. May we know God's close presence with us, in our flesh –with its beauty and fragility – in our hearts and in those around us, whatever our

circumstances and reality this Christmas.

Wishing you Peace, Joy and a very Happy Christmas



Baptism and Confirmation at Great St. Mary's


We are delighted that we have two Sunday Eucharists with baptisms coming up in the next few months at Great St Mary's, with one adult and three children preparing to be baptized. If you have been thinking about baptism for you or your child, please, let us know as you will be most welcome to join these four in being baptized at these services.

The dates of the forthcoming baptism services are Sunday 7 December (10am Choral Eucharist Service) and Sunday 1 February (10am All Together Choral Eucharist). Adults who are baptized also prepare for confirmation, and we are hoping to have a confirmation service here at Great St Mary's in May or June 2026 (date to be confirmed). We invite older children (from year 7 onwards) to think about confirmation and join preparation sessions.

Baptism is both a sign and a sacrament (an act through which Christians believe there is an effective spiritual change) of commitment to the Christian faith. If the baptism candidate is a child, the commitment extends to the prayerful oversight of their parents or carers and godparents. Baptism is when the worshipping community welcomes the person being baptized into the family of the church.

Confirmation is a service during which people who were baptized as a child can make an affirmation of faith for themselves, and this affirmation is confirmed (blessed) by the bishop. At GSM we offer preparation sessions for those who are considering confirmation which are intended to be an opportunity to explore your faith with others. These will take place during the 2026 Lent term.

If you are considering baptism or confirmation for yourself or your child, then please do contact Jutta, Ally, Clare or Rosie (clergy@gsm.cam.ac.uk) to learn more about what this involves and how we can support you/them in terms of preparation.



Great St Mary's Godparents

All children who are baptized require 2-3 godparents who have been baptized (in any Christian church of any denomination) and who are prepared to commit to praying for that child as they grow up. Over time, godparents

might end up being closely connected with their godchildren in terms of this prayerful oversight which very often becomes a source of mutual joy between godparent and godchild. There is no expectation that godparents have any other responsibility for the child such as financial support or guardianship.

If you sense a calling to take on the role of godparent and would be open to be a godparent of a child in the GSM community, do please discuss this with one of the clergy.



Alongside attending in-person facilitated discussions at Holy Trinity, each


week there is 60-90 minutes of online-based learning from home which you can do at a time to suit you.
