

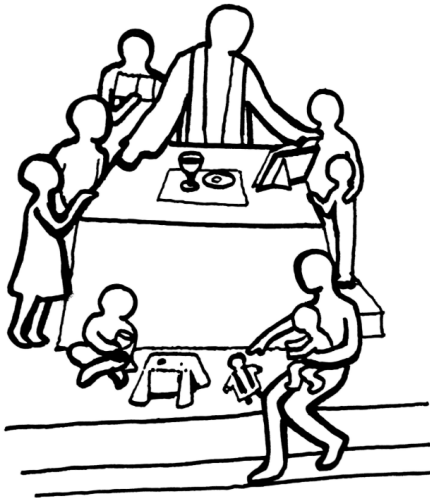

From the Associate Vicar

Dear Friends,

On 7th June at the 10am All Together Eucharist some of our younger congregation members will be taking communion for the first time. Rosie has been exploring the Eucharist with them in the 'Sharing bread' sessions, as they prepare for this. Sharing in their excitement and joy at becoming communicant members of the church is a wonderful opportunity for us all to deepen our experience of sharing in communion. To that end, there won't be a sermon, but instead a series of moments for guided reflection through the service - invitations to open our hearts and minds to what God is doing in us as we break bread together. This may lead to us growing in our understanding, which is no bad thing, but intellectual understanding isn't the end goal. We don't have to demonstrate a full and comprehensive account of exactly how the sacrament of the Eucharist 'works' (not least because there are many different, faithful, understandings in different church traditions) in order to participate in it, and to be transformed through our participation.



If you have never really had the chance to explore what receiving communion means to you, or if you'd like to have some resources to reflect on your own or with others, please do be in touch with any of the ministry team, and we would be very happy to enable a conversation, or provide some materials you might enjoy.

I expect to learn something new on 7th June by exploring the Eucharist together as we share in it, but above all I pray that we all will come away from the service with a deeper sense that 'we are what we eat', in other words that we are,

together, in all our variety and diversity, the Body of Christ.



Sat 6 June - Art exhibition closes in Michaelhouse



Charlotte Jones is an artist and teacher based in the West Midlands. She attained an MA in Fine Art from Coventry University in 2010. Following a break in practice she returned to painting attending short courses at Heatherley's School of Art in London. Charlotte primarily creates still life oil paintings observing objects such as flowers, food, vases, fabric and found items.

Charlotte has exhibited work in group shows at the Mall Galleries, RBSA Gallery, Derby Museum and Art Gallery, and the Herbert Art Gallery. She has also held solo shows at Rugby Art Gallery.

'Pots' is Charlotte's first solo exhibition since returning to painting. The exhibition at Michaelhouse Café, explores the beauty and elegance of spring flowers. The plants in each still life are arranged simply, presented in the pots they were purchased in, against an unadorned backdrop. The setup allows the focus of each work to be the majesty and promise of each flowering plant.

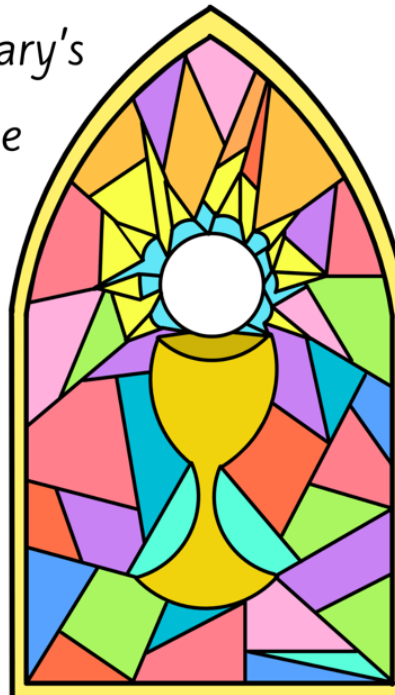

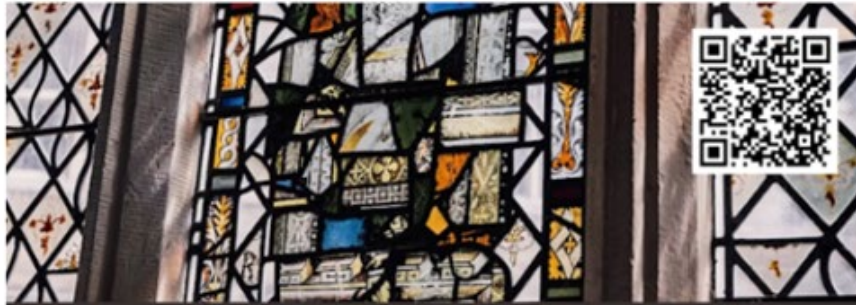

Sharing Bread: Exploring Holy Communion



A number of children in the congregation would like to start receiving the bread at communion, which is lovely. At Great St. Mary's, the pattern has to be set aside a particular Sunday for children to take communion for the first time, and to offer a few sessions before that for the children to explore the theology and practice of Holy Communion together. This year these sessions were called 'Sharing Bread' and have taken place after the 10 o'clock service in April and May.

The First Communion Sunday will be Sunday 7th June, which will be an All Together service. Some children at Great St. Mary's have been receiving communion from a young age, especially those who attend[ed] The Ark - which is our Tuesday morning communion service for 0-5s and their parents/carers. That is lovely too! They are also very welcome - in fact, encouraged! - to sign up for the Sharing Bread sessions, so that they can think about Holy Communion some more as well.

Easter collections

Thank you for the wonderful support at Easter. We also are most appreciative of a very generous anonymous donation of £2,000 which together with an allocation from the Sansom Bequest enabled the following allocations to be made:

- Notice if anybody is de-cluttering or house-clearing and offer to dispose of their books. I have room in my garage to store them.

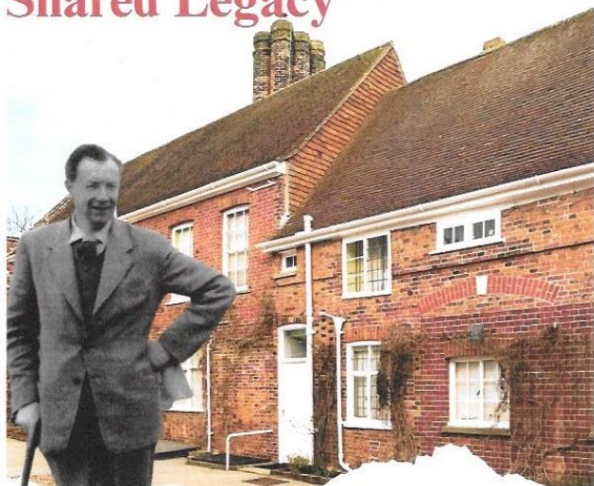


That would enable us to continue to offer books for sale. It does bring people in!

Fund raising for the pews project

Benjamin Britten and Peter Pears at the Red House: Shared Lives, Shared Legacy



The Academy of Great St Mary's Orchestra held two very enjoyable events which raised £1,000 for the pews project: On 9 May, Haydn's Nelson Mass 'Come and Sing' attracted over 70 singers, with Catherine White soprano and Ally Barrett alto, and together with the orchestra created a wonderful performance. It was so lovely that visitors coming into the church during the rehearsal heard the church full of beautiful music. We were blessed with a fine day serving 100 for tea in the churchyard (after earlier predicted thunderstorms!)

On 16 May, Christophe Hilton Head of Archives and Library at Britten Pears Arts, gave a fascinating illustrated talk entitled, "*Benjamin Britten and Peter Pears at the Red House, Shared Lives, Shared*

Legacy". He featured Britten writing Peter Grimes, then the composition of his War Requiem for the consecration service for the new Coventry Cathedral and his deep concern for the devastating effects of war. There were memorable references to personal letters from Queen Elizabeth II to 'Dear Ben', asking if he had time to write a piece to celebrate the Queen Mother's 75th birthday and then for the Silver Jubilee. She also invited him to be Master of the Queen's Music following the death of Sir Arthur Bliss but sadly Britten was too ill to accept. He was made a life peer in 1976. An outing to the Red House will be planned this summer!

Ely Cathedral



Ely Cathedral: Parish Passes and Pilgrimage Visits

Anyone on our electoral roll is eligible for a Parish Pass, which allows free entry to the Cathedral at times it is open to the visiting public. Attendance at worship is, of course, always free. The pass is for entry only and does not cover any tours or events which require paid for admission. Passes must only be used by the named parishioner and are not transferable. Proof of ID may be required when you visit. Your pass remains valid as long as you are resident in the Diocese. Parish Pass application forms can be [downloaded here](#). Please note that older Parish Passes, even if past their expiry date, remain valid for entry. After completing the form, please ask one of

the churchwardens to counter-sign. Paper copies of the form are also available from the churchwardens.

Please take the form to the Ticket Office at Ely Cathedral between 10am and 4pm, Monday to Saturday, to collect your pass.

Knowing the dimensions will help me plan where everything will go (I'll try and include as much as possible). I will reply in early June to confirm which of everyone's submissions we have room for, and let you know when to bring the artwork to Michaelhouse.


